tring instruments speak in a human voice. Their up and down bow strokes are like the inhalations and exhalations of breath. With their seemingly infinite colors, they convey the Argus Quartet full range of human emotions and feelings, from agony to pure Dana Kelley, Viola bliss. And they are also superhuman. They can sing in the realm of birds; their breaths can extend to eons.

This album grew out of my two-year collaboration with the June-September, 2018 Argus Quartet, an ensemble whose versatility has enabled me to navigate freely within this wide range of human and superhuman Track 7: Lucas DeCicco / Macaulay possibilities. With Argus, I explore the ubiquitous themes of life, death, memory, and change. The album begins with the titular Track 10: Geoffrey A. Keller / track "Respiri," my homage to late composer Jonathan Harvey, whose musical evocations of breathing became the main subject Edited by Juri Seo of my work. The second piece, "Suite for Cello," deals with ideas of memory and identity. Despite the familiar Bach-like surface, Special thanks: there is a lingering sense of displacement—a result of its clashing tones and split harmonic center. If "Respiri" ends with a peaceful Cornell Lab of Ornithology death, "String Quartet - Infinite Season" commences an unending cycle of births through a journey that traces the sounds of nature Copland House as they change throughout a yearly cycle.
